an original and eclectic view of cookbooks as political acts cookbooks are not political in conventional ways they neither proclaim as do manifestos nor do they forbid as do laws they do not command agreement as do arguments and their stipulations often lack specificity cook until browned yet as repositories of human taste cookbooks transmit specific blends of flavor texture and nutrition across space and time cookbooks both form and reflect who we are in cookbook politics kennan ferguson explores the sensual and political implications of these repositories demonstrating how they create nations establish ideologies shape international relations and structure communities cookbook politics argues that cookbooks highlight aspects of our lives we rarely recognize as political taste production domesticity collectivity and imagination and considers the ways in which cookbooks have or do politics from the most overt to the most subtle cookbooks turn regional diversity into national unity as pellegrino artusi s science in the kitchen and the art of eating well did for italy in 1891 politically affiliated organizations compile and sell cookbooks for example the early united nations published the world s favorite recipes from the first baptist church of midland tennessee s community cookbook to julia child s mastering the art of french cooking to the italian futurists proto fascist guide to food preparation ferguson demonstrates how cookbooks mark desires and reveal social commitments your table becomes a representation of who you are authoritative yet flexible collective yet individualized cooperative yet personal cookbooks invite participation editing and transformation created to convey flavor and taste across generations communities and nations they enact the continuities and changes of social lives their functioning in the name of creativity and preparation with

readers happily consuming them in similar ways makes cookbooks an exemplary model for democratic politics

italian americans in film and other media examines the representation of the italian immigrant experience from d w griffith s biograph italian dramas 1908 1913 to the present day building on the editors previous volume italian americans in film this collection broadens their scope to address marginalized aspects of italian Americanness including the work of women directors and depictions of same sex relationships the book consists of three parts part i the immigrant experience focuses on feature films and is divided into two sections silent films which analyses some of griffith s early films and barker s the italian 1915 and revising gender perspectives which includes chapters focusing on single films such as dmytryk s christ in concrete 1949 de michiel s tarantella 1995 and bonifacio s amexicano 2007 and survey essays that discuss the italian american celluloid closet and some of savoca s films part ii italian americans in other media offers a wide range of essays informed by different approaches that investigate the immigrant experience in terms of transmediality and transnationality the types of media examined in this section include television and graphic novels as well as puppetry instagram and internet memes part iii contains interviews with italian american scholars movie directors and performers together the contributions to this collection demonstrate the vitality mutation and persistence of italian Americanness in visual media

in this book deborah geis offers a new approach to the evolving genre of culinary films that center on the acts of eating and cooking through close analyses of ten different films these films range from the classics like big night 1996 and babette s feast 1987 to later box office hits like chef 2014 and to films that deserve a second look like east side sushi 2014 burnt 2015 and mid august lunch 2008 throughout these analyses the book focuses on tropes including the big dinner as it connects to intercultural and transcultural communities the self destructive perfectionism of the obsessive chef and the craft of cooking in relation to aging and mortality geis invites readers and viewers to experience food driven narrative films with an appetite for appreciating the visual ingredients and the ways in which they construct pleasure through the act of looking as a vicarious approach to consuming the actual food drawing on the work of film theorist christian metz geis ultimately poses a new paradigm for watching and understanding culinary cinema as a significant and constantly evolving genre that comes with its own conventions and contemporary filmmakers who seek to expand and transform those conventions in surprising ways

how is the meaning of food created communicated and continually transformed how are food practices defined shaped delineated constructed modified resisted and reinvented by whom and for whom these are but a few of the questions who decides competing narratives in constructing tastes consumption and choice explores part i taste authenticity identity explicitly centres on the connection between food and identity construction part ii food discourses focuses on how food related language shapes perceptions that in turn construct particular behaviours that in turn demonstrate underlying value systems thus as a collection this volume explores how tastes are shaped formed delineated and acted upon by normalising socio cultural processes and in some instances how those very processes are actively resisted and
